


Lewis Woodrow Keller, Jr.

Maj. Lewis Woodrow Keller, Jr. peacefully passed away February 4th, 2018. At the young age of 74 years old, Lew left a loving wife, two beautiful daughters, and five grandchildren. He was born on September 3rd, 1943 in Lansdale, Pennsylvania to Lewis Woodrow Keller Sr. and Alverda Marie Keller. He was the oldest of three siblings. During his adolescence, Lewis devoted his time to the completion of his Eagle Scout in the Valley Forge Council of Boy Scouts of America in 1962, as well as graduating from Valley Forge Military Academy. He then went on to join the JROTC Exploring program and enlist in the United States Army.
