Quentin C. Smith, age 76, of Concordia, KS, went home to be with the Lord on Wednesday, May 18, 2022 at Salina Regional Health Center, Salina, KS. He was born on July 22, 1945 in Canton, Ohio to Cyrillas “Cy” H. & Martha A. (Starkey) Smith and was raised on a dairy farm.

He graduated from Glenwood High School in 1963. He later graduated from Ohio State University and earned his master's degree in Agricultural Economics from Kansas State University.
